RESEARCH SEMESTER PROGRAMME

CWI Research Semester Programmes focus on challenging topics to which the Dutch research community can make an important research contribution with both scientific and societal impact. These programmes:

- aim to facilitate the exchange of ideas, the development of joint knowledge and the building of lasting relationships between (inter)national researchers
- seek to create time and space for collaboration
- are comprised of multiple activities over a semester-length, such as workshops, schools and seminars, for junior and senior researchers
- can involve a sabbatical stay at CWI

CWI would like to invite colleagues from Dutch universities to participate in Research Semester Programmes, as well as to jointly set up new programmes. CWI will run three programmes in 2024, on AI, Media and Democracy, on Uncertainty Quantification for High-Dimensional Problems and on Trustworthy Generative AI. A new call for proposals for Research Semester Programmes in 2025 – 2027 will be opened in April 2024.
